Mayor Brening called the meeting to order at 5:02 pm

Invocation and Pledge of Allegiance given by Mayor Brening

Mayor Pro Tem Pike requested to amend the agenda to include MDA Business as 6 (a) Councilmember Warrior made the motion to adopt the agenda to include MDA Business, Mayor Pro Tem Pike seconded the motion, all approved.

Mayor Pro Tem Pike made the motion to approve the August 8, 2022, minutes, Councilmember Warrior seconded, all approved.

Councilmember Warrior made the motion to approve the August 3, 2022, work session minutes, Mayor Brening seconded, all approved.

Mayor Brening made the motion to approve the Special Called Meeting on August 29<sup>th</sup> and not August 25<sup>th</sup>, Councilmember Warrior seconded, all approved.

Mayor Brening read a Proclamation recognizing Ms. Mae Walker as one of the oldest citizens in Manchester.

Mayor Pro Tem Pike made the motion to renew the Bow Hunting Lease, Councilmember Warrior seconded the motion, all approved.

Councilmember Wilkins made the motion to approve appointments, Councilmember Warrior seconded, Mayor Brening approved, Mayor Pro Tem Pike abstained from voting.

Mayor Brening thanked everyone that has served on the MDA.

City Manager Mark Pullium spoke to the council about taking the city's extra funds and putting the monies into a Georgia Fund One Account, where the money will draw interest at a higher rate than traditional banking accounts. City Manager requested that the council close the CD at Colony, agree to establish new accounts for Georgia Fund One and sign the Resolutions authorizing the accounts. Councilmember Warrior made the motion, Mayor Pro Tem Pike seconded, all approved.

City Manager Pullium updated the council on the city budget, the Department Heads are doing a good job staying within their budget or under.

Property Taxes have not started coming in yet.

City is building up the TSPLOST Fund and nothing has been spent out of that account since the paving.

ARPA money came in after the budget was done, but the city does have the cash on hand.

Kathy Storey will be leaving October 31<sup>st</sup> and City Manager Pullium would like to hire Abbot, Jordon and Koon, CPA to provide bookkeeping for the city. AJK will draw up a contract with the city in the next couple weeks. Mayor Brening liked the idea to have an outside company to do the books, this will provide better checks and balances and possibly save the city money in the long run. The city needs to move on this now.
