- 1. Penny Hale spoke to the Council about the proposed rock Quarry that is to be on Pleasant Valley Rd in Talbot County, Ms. Hale expressed her opposition to the quarry and the unpredictable damage it could have not only on Rush Creek Reservoir, surrounding houses and wells that supply drinking water to the residents. After discussion of the quarry the council agreed to send a letter voicing their concerns if the quarry was approved.
